By Law Amendments Planned

One of Bob Pillions first orders of business as President was to update the by-laws reflecting the current operations of MSSRA. The following amendments were approved by the Board of Directors at their first meeting and will be presented to the membership for final approval at the January General Membership Meeting.

AMENDMENT 1

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 3 Any person seeking membership shall submit an application to the Secretary Treasurer or Newsletter Editor. Once the dues are paid in full, the applicant shall become a full member.

RATIONAL – This amendment reflects current operations.

AMENDMENT 2

ARTICLE IV - MEMBERSHIP DUES

SECTION 1 The active membership dues are ~~\$20.00~~ \$30.00 per year, per family. Due January each year ~~dues to be paid to the Treasurer~~ and if not paid by March 1, the member will be dropped from the active membership.

RATIONAL – The dues were increased to \$30.00 in January 2002 and the by-laws were not amended to reflect the increase. This amendment corrects this error and is an editorial clarification.

AMENDMENT 3

ARTICLE IV - MEMBERSHIP DUES

SECTION 4 Membership includes all family members i.e. spouse and minor children living in the same household.

RATIONAL – Section 4 is added for clarification.

AMENDMENT 4

ARTICLE V - MEMBERSHIP OBLIGATIONS

SECTION 2 All members are strongly encouraged to have vehicles used in Club functions and pass the National Street Rod Associations safety inspection.

RATIONAL – This amendment is for editorial clarification.

AMENDMENT 5

ARTICLE VI - OFFICERS

SECTION 1 The President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer are voted to office by the general membership. Two or more members at large are selected by the President to serve on the Board of Directors during the elected Presidents term year. If the President is re-elected for a subsequent term the appointed members of the Board may or may not change. The elected officers of the Club include President, Vice President, Secretary, ~~and~~ Treasurer and ~~Two~~ two or more members of the Association at large, other than an officer, ~~will be named to meet with the officers and together form the Club's Board of Directors. Said members at large shall be appointed by the President and serve during the elected Presidents term.~~

RATIONAL – This amendment is for editorial clarification and permits more than two Members-at-Large on the Board of Directors.

AMENDMENT 6

ARTICLE VII - ELECTIONS

SECTION 4 Nominations must be made from the floor ~~during a regular~~ at the October or November meeting.

RATIONAL – This amendment reflects current operations.

AMENDMENT 7

ARTICLE VII - ELECTIONS

SECTION 5 Elected officers will be decided by a majority vote of all active members, one vote per family membership, present and in good standing at the voting meeting.

RATIONAL – This amendment clarifies who is eligible to vote.

AMENDMENT 8

ARTICLE VII - ELECTIONS

SECTION 6 In the event an elected officer is not able to complete their term, a special election will be held at either a special meeting called by the Board of Directors or the next general membership meeting.

RATIONAL – This is a new section intended to help clarify replacement of an officer midterm.

AMENDMENT 9

ARTICLE VIII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1 The President will preside over all meetings of the Club; serve as Chairman of the Board of Directors; act as Ex-officio member of all committees; issue the call for regular and special Board of Directors meeting; schedule regular elections and be sure ensure that meetings are held in accordance with this Constitution; and carry out the directives of the Board of Directors.

RATIONAL – This amendment is for editorial clarification and reflects current operations.

AMENDMENT 10

ARTICLE VIII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 4 The Treasurer will supervise all records of the Club; will collect dues; will collect all other income due the Club; will maintain the Club Accounting books; will make payment from Club funds when so ordered by the Club President or Board of Directors; and make regular reports of the Club's financial status to the Club at its monthly meetings

RATIONAL – This amendment is for editorial clarification.

AMENDMENT 11

ARTICLE IX - APPOINTED POSITIONS

SECTION 1 The President shall appoint an active Club member to be the Clubs Newsletter editor, and also an Events Chairman.

SUBSECTION 1 Newsletter Editor will be appointed by the Club President; will maintain the membership records; give notice of regular and special meetings of the membership and the Board of Directors, based on the directive from the President and will over see the publication and distribution of the Club's monthly newsletter.

SUBSECTION 2 Events Chairman will be appointed by the Club President; will maintain events calendar and schedule events for the up coming year will, be responsible in obtaining permits and insurance coverage of all Club events.

SECTION 1 Newsletter Editor will be appointed by the Club President; will maintain the membership records; give notice of regular and special meetings of the membership and the Board of Directors, based on the directive from the President and will over see the publication and distribution of the Club's monthly newsletter

SECTION 2 Two or more members of the Association at large, other than an officer, will be named to meet with the officers and

together form the Club's Board of Directors. Said members at large shall be appointed by the President and serve during the elected Presidents term.

SECTION 3 The President should appoint an event chair two months in advance for small events and up to a year in advance for a major event. The event chair is responsible for obtaining permits, proof of insurance coverage, securing the location, and anything else that may be required.

RATIONAL – This amendment is a complete rewrite of Article IX for editorial clarification and reflects current operations.

AMENDMENT 12

ARTICLE X MEETINGS

SECTION 1 A majority A minimum of 15 of the active members in good standing constitutes a quorum at the general membership meeting.

RATIONAL – This amendment redefines a realistic quorum at a general membership meeting.

AMENDMENT 13

ARTICLE X MEETINGS

SECTION 2 Members General membership meetings will be held meet once a month, at a time and place set forth by the Board of the Directors.

RATIONAL – This amendment is for editorial clarification and reflects current operations.

AMENDMENT 14

ARTICLE XI - AMENDMENTS

SECTION 1 Suggested changes to Club By-Laws can originate from general or special membership meetings or Board of Directors meetings. Written notice must be made at least one week before the proposed amendment is voted upon. The decision to amend the Club By-Laws will be made by the Board of Directors only. The Club These By-Laws can be amended by the Board of Directors at a regular at a general membership or special meeting of the membership. Written notice must be made at least one week before the proposed amendment is voted upon.

RATIONAL – This amendment is for editorial clarification and reflects current operations.

All I can do is pass along this warning ~ We are under attack! Unless something drastic happens, pretty soon everyone will have to suffer these awful indignities.


New Meeting Location

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
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

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
